




Jennifer Silkenson

Featured Professor - Dr. Goetz

As students with ambitions of graduate school and careers, we must recognize that forming academic relationships with faculty is vital to our success and future potential. Cal State Fullerton's plethora of quality faculty can make getting to know individual professors an overwhelming task, but don't fret! Identifying professors that are most active and personable can help narrow down potential faculty members to work with.

Easily one of the most personable and active professors at CSUF, Dr. (pronounced "Gets") has been teaching at Cal State Fullerton since 2007 and has been an Associate Professor of Psychology since 2011. When asked about what has been the best part of teaching at CSUF, Dr. Goetz stated, "It's the students. Every semester I get to meet students who are either incredibly intelligent or just genuinely good people. Sometimes I see younger versions of myself in some students, and we all know from social psychology the bias that can have. I swear this answer isn't influenced by the fact that this is going in the Peer Mentors newsletter where the primary audience is students." I am inclined to believe him.

Dr. Goetz completed his bachelors in Psychology, with a second concentration in Biology, in 2002 at the University of Texas at Austin. He then went on to earn his Ph.D. in Evolutionary Psychology from Florida Atlantic University in 2007. When describing what stood about psychology he explained, "Appreciating that humans are just one of millions of species on Earth, I became interested in what constitutes our species-typical design. In other words, I was curious about basic human nature." His numerous publications suggest that he was indeed very curious.

Currently, Dr. Goetz's research interests implement evolutionary theory to examine a wide range of topics in psychology including: sexual coercion in romantic relationships, assessment of infidelity and

formidability, kissing, visible white sclera, and...eyelashes (Confused? Look up honest-signaling). Additionally, he is the academic advisor to both the Psychology Department Student Association (PDSA) and the Society for Interdisciplinary Research on Evolution (SIRE).

When asked about his interests outside of academia, Dr. Goetz revealed, "I'm now a part-time farmer. Seriously. With my wife [Dr. Causey, also a professor at CSUF], I manage an orchard, four dairy goats, and six chickens. I now spend weekends building fences for pasture rotation, rehabbing our soil, learning about nitrogen to carbon ratios for composting, and building mini-barns. I punch anyone in the face who tells me that they're too busy." Let that be a warning to idle students!

Dr. Goetz also confessed an alternative to teaching he might have once considered, "If I weren't a psychology professor, I'd probably be a writer. Maybe a science writer. Probably a failed science writer. I've enjoyed writing since I was kid, and I can remember starting all these little writing projects. When I was really young, I wrote a story about what the future would look like. It was titled "The Fucher" because I was awful at spelling. I'm still an awful speller."Dr. Goetz teaches research methods, evolutionary psychology, and human sexual behavior. Take a class with him if you get the opportunity and, as with any professor, work hard, make a good impression, and see what opportunities result!


