But did you know that as a CSUF graduate, the Career Center can still assist you in your search for a professional career? For an entire year after your graduation date, the CSUF Career Center offers free access to all Career Center services. These services include access to career fairs, one-on-one appointments, help preparing resumes or CVs, mock interviews, and access to Titan Connection to name a few. One of the perks that recent graduates have is the "drive-thru" system, which means you can drop in without making an appointment beforehand. Alumni who graduated over a year ago still have access to Career fairs and Career planning workshops. Professor Spotlight: Dr. Espinoza

Dr. Russ Espinoza is a well esteemed and respected figure in the California State University, Fullerton (CSUF) community. He has won numerous awards as both an educator and faculty member. His awards include "Teacher of the Year" and "Faculty of the Year" for the years of 2011, 2012, 2013, 2016, and 2017. He has also won various awards specific to his department, Humanities and Social Sciences.



One of the most interesting awards he has received was for his work in researching bias in the use of the death penalty. It is called the Death Penalty Focus Award. Espinoza's research has proven that low economic status African Americans are subjected to the death penalty significantly more than any other group of individuals. This award ceremony was held where the Golden Globes occurs each year in Beverly Hills.

Dr. Espinoza received his Bachelor's degree at California State University, Northridge. He spent his undergraduate years researching Psychology in Law. He also received a Master's degree in Family Therapy from Northridge. He has worked as a counselor and in group homes for both children and adults. Dr. Espinoza pursued his Ph.d. in Psychology in Law at the University of Nebraska.

Dr. Espinoza did not start off planning to pursue a career in Psychology. At the age of seventeen, he dropped out of college to become a musician in Hollywood. He joined a rock and roll band called "Wretched" and happily toured the world as lead guitarist and songwriter. He feels he has had a decent exposure to psychological issues due to each of his bandmates ending up in jail or with a mental illness. He says this led to a natural progression into studying forensic psychology.

Some interesting facts about Dr. Espinoza is that he partied with some famous rock bands including "Poison" and "Guns and Roses." He also had the same band manager as "Guns and Roses."

Today Dr. Espinoza happily calls himself an "old Dad." He loves teaching his two year old son how to play guitar.

As a final note, Dr. Espinoza says that to be successful in psychology, you need to work harder than everyone else.

If you are interested in taking one of his classes, he instructs Research Methods, Psychology in Law, Psychology of Prejudice and Discrimination, Social Psychology, Graduate courses in Diversity, and Personality Psychology.
