Psychology Peer Mentors (PM) offer mentoring. We invite undergraduate psychology majors and MA/MS students to join Psychology Peer Mentors. Peer Mentor activities include:

- Staffing the Psychology Peer Mentor Office (H - 525 B)
- Offering help for students in PSYC 101, 110, and other psychology courses
- Supporting the Psychology Advisement Office
- Publishing the Peer Mentor Newsletter
- Sponsoring a Psychology Day event or activity

Psychology 494 Units:

Students electing academic credit complete an “activity plan” with the faculty advisor no later than the third week of classes and keep a portfolio of their activities. Portfolios will be reviewed during Finals Week. Students may enroll in one to three units.

- One Unit: Two to three hours per week; minimum of one office hour and attendance at periodic group meetings.
- Two Units: Four hours per week; minimum of two office hours and attendance at periodic group meetings.
- Three Units: Six hours per week; minimum of three office hours and attendance at periodic group meetings. Students electing three units are required to submit articles for the Newsletter.

Once your application has been reviewed, the faculty advisor will contact you about acceptance into the program and how to register.
